### **Research Income in Canada**

Terminology note: In Canada, a Principal Investigator (PI) is defined as an individual who shares responsibility for the direction of the proposed activities. Multi-PI teams (usually 2-3 co-PIs) are common for projects that require a team science approach, with the lead grant applicant known as the “Nominated Principal Investigator” (NPI). A Co-Investigator (Co-I) is defined as an individual who contributes to the proposed activities (Co-Is are similar to Chief Investigators in Australia). Finally, there are Collaborators, whose role in the proposed activities is to provide a specific service like recruitment, and Knowledge Users, who are likely to be able to use research results to make informed decisions about health policies and programs.
